

## Title: Starship "Enterprise"

### 2010 - 2016

- Anna Bligh admits health and human service systems are crisis driven. Government supports social reform towards a proactive system.
- Productivity commissioner recommends growing social enterprises to tackle broken social services systems.
- Social movement delivers good corporate citizenship.
- Premier and PM announce new federal tax breaks for social enterprise activity (profit goes to direct service provision). New social responsibility corporations laws announced and government. Government procurement policy encourage corporates to be meet social responsibility benchmarks: QLD mining industry responds to support child safety in the State – now contributing 10% of profits for our vulnerable children. Big 4 banks compete for market share of new micro-finance market
- Bligh claims NGOs and social enterprise can do it better. QLD is getting out of direct service delivery and focus on policy and regulation.
- Government puts its 'neck on the line' and leads reform agenda by redirecting 5% of human service delivery budget into seed funds for new human service partnerships in social enterprise.
- New innovations - human services enterprise partnerships formed between government, business and NGOs.
- NGOs forced to adopt new and creative business models to give individuals a voice.
- New federal curriculum educations stresses social responsibility – builds social awareness and citizenship in schooling and education.
- Nation equity in population benchmarking.

### 2017 - 2022

- State social wellness indicators improve (strong downward trend in social indicators). Successful outcomes encourage government to dig deeper - government now redirects 15% of human service delivery budget into seed funds for new partnerships in social enterprise.
- Significant budget saving from change in investment mix.
- Social enterprise and community co-operatives are the fastest growing sector in Australia: QLD has 8,000 recipients of micro-finance. Approvals grow 40% in first 12 months.
- Corporates alarmed at shift in employment patterns: Social enterprises become 'employers of choice' for new graduates.
- Investment patterns shift towards NGOs with early intervention focus.
- Enterprise partnership innovations reduce red tape and service delivery costs – significant funds redirected to urban and remote infrastructure development.
- Fully accessible public infrastructure and services rollout out – trains, buses, planes and buildings accessible to all.

### 2023 - 2030

- Communities are in the driving seat and individual needs are met.
- Evidence-based improvements provide confident for governments to re-direct 25% of human service delivery budget into creating new and building existing partnerships in social enterprise.
- NGO dollars go further. Government investment in social reform results in budget savings.
- Early intervention plans working – participation and employments rates for disabled people in the workforce leading the world.
- Prisons and detention centres closing down.
- Chronic diseases reduces and more people age in place.
- Reduction in tertiary services (as a % of population) due to demand reductions.
- Other jurisdictions look to QLD as a model for world's best practice in social enterprise practices.
